Points will be based on the Rider ONLY

Points awarded as follows:

5 pts for 1st, 4 pts for 2nd,
3 pts for 3rd, 2 points for 4th,
and 1 pt for 5th

1. **4-H rules will be followed for these classes:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Trail Class, and Reining. **KWAH rules will be followed** for Bareback Horsemanship and all speed events.

2. **Cloverleaf:** In running this race, contestant may go to either the right or left barrel first, but must make one left turn and two right turns or one right turn and two left turns. Rider will be assessed a five second penalty for each barrel knocked over.

3. **Pole Bending:** There will be a line of 6 poles, set 21 feet apart with the last pole in line to be placed on the turning line. Contestant may start either to the right or left of the first pole. Run to last pole, make a right or left hand turn, weave through poles and then turn first pole and weave back. Run straight back home across starting line. A five second penalty will be assessed for each pole knocked over and contestant is disqualified for touching pole with a hand or failure to follow the course.

4. **Flag Race:** Flag is placed in can atop barrel that is on the turning line. Can holding flag may be knocked down or over. There will be a 5 second penalty assessed for a barrel knocked over. Rider will be DQ'd if flag is dropped or flag is used as whip or bat. Rider may turn either right or left at barrel.

5. **Flying W:** Two pole bending poles are placed on the turning line 30 feet from the fence. One pole is placed in the center of the arena 60 feet from the turning line. Rider will run to first pole on either side of arena and make a right or left turn toward center of arena, proceed to center pole, make a turn in opposite direction of first turn, continue to pole on opposite side of arena from first pole and make a right or left turn towards fence and on to finish line. Rider will be disqualified for not completing the pattern or touching pole with hand. A 5-second penalty will be assessed for each pole knocked over.

6. **Two-Barrel Flag:** Contestant races to the first 30-gallon barrel, which is set 30 feet off of starting line, picks up stake with colored flag and races to second barrel on turning line. The contestant deposits the stake into the barrel on the turning line and picks up stake with a different colored flag and races back to the first barrel and deposits that stake into the barrel. Contestant needs to raise right or left hand when entering the arena to tell the arena crew what side of barrel they will pick up the stakes. Contestant will be disqualified for dropping stake or knocking over a barrel. In the event of a broken stake, the portion remaining in the barrel must be the full diameter of the stake to be considered a qualified ride.

7. **In case of a tie for overall points earned...**rider with the most firsts, then seconds, etc. will win. If that doesn't break the tie, there will be a flip of the coin.
